

## Turkey Napkin Ring

We just love this Thanksgiving craft created for us by our friend Jodi Levine of the amazing crafting duo at Super Make It. Just color, cut, and assemble these turkey napkin rings to instantly dress up your Thanksgiving table.

### Instructions:

1. Color body, beak, and tail.
2. Cut out body, beak, and tail (using pinking shears for turkey's head/body if you'd like). Parents, your little ones may need help cutting out the shapes!
3. Fold tail as indicated by dotted lines in accordion style – one fold forward, the next fold backward. You can use the edge of a pair of scissors to make sharp creases.
4. Turn the sides of the turkey's body back into a ring, and slightly overlap the two ends, secure with staples (at top and bottom of overlap).
5. Staple base of the body ring to the front of the creased tail.
6. Fold the beak in half at the long-dotted line, then fold back the small side pieces.
7. Attach the beak by gluing the small side pieces just below the eyes; let dry completely.
8. Roll up a napkin and slide it into the ring.
